Group Work

Each of attending delegates received a file with real-life example of how a young woman slipped through safety net from all institutions and became homeless. Delegates read the case through chronological order of her life events. They also received documents how the Centre for Social Care was involved in the process of taking away this girl from her abusive parents and all the other legal procedures.

When the delegates read the text, they had the opportunity to have an open discussion with each other and they also listen to a number of initiatives currently taking place on related issue including:

Key Messages:

- Delegates were working in groups and discussing this real-life example.
- They concluded that this is a very hard case study and was very difficult to handle it.
- It was also the problem of our rigid school and social care system.
- Social workers were not enough careful of this girl's family situation and they responded when it was already too late.
- Slovenian public should be aware that we have in Slovenia cases of child homelessness.
- We should work more on prevention, on education in families.
- The big problem in Slovenia are institutions not capable dealing with Roma children and their culture.
