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Group Work

Each of attending delegates received a file with real-life example of how a young woman slipped through safety net from all institutions and became homeless. Delegates read the case through chronological order of her life events. They also received documents how the Centre for Social Care was involved in the process of taking away this girl from her abusive parents and all the other legal procedures.

When the delegates read the text, they had the opportunity to have an open discussion with each other and they also listen to a number of initiatives currently taking place on related issue including:

Key Messages

- Delegates thought that this case was very difficult to solve it and because of this circumstances young girl became homeless.
- Sometimes it is also the problem in our laws for social care because they are very rigid and social workers do not have competences to take children from violent parents.
- Delegates also agreed that was also the problem in our school system because they also did not notice the problematic behaviour or that child and did not sent a report to the police and Centre for Social Care.
- At the end of discussion delegates stresses out that the problem of homeless children is very small in Slovenia but that does not mean that it is not necessary to talk about the problem and we all need to pay more attention precisely because of the economic crisis.

The delates also mentioned:

- The problem of custody and the possibility of renewal of its definition
- Procedures, organization and standards in the field of foster care
- Children with severe behavioral
- Custody arrangements in international perspective
- The life histories of persons deprived of normal family life
- Expert basis for upgrading the institute custody
